The PE and Sport Premium Grant 2021/22

The PE and Sports grant funding allocation in this year's budget is £17,810.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of the PE, physical activity and sport they provide.

The PE and sport premium has been used to secure improvements in the following 5 key indicators:

- Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- Broader experience of a range of sports and physical activities offered to all pupils.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

In fulfilling these 5 key factors, Pontesbury CE Primary School PE and sport premium was spent on the following:
